



Licence Agreement Summary

Summary Changes:

Whilst not so keen to use the IReL Licence because of the nature of JSTOR, they have agreed to, on the basis that they want to make a number of changes. JSTOR state that they are not a journals publisher, but acting as an archive service for many individual publishers. This means that they often cannot meet the requirements stipulated in many model journal licences. JSTOR made numerous changes to the licence including a wide variety of insertions and deletions to the licence so I have summarised the main points below:

- The term Publisher removed throughout the licence and JSTOR inserted.
- All clauses removed that discuss “local mounting” as JSTOR does not allow this.
- JSTOR allow links to content but does not allow the posting of stand-alone articles even in electronic form. Local copies can not be created but links to materials can be used. Clauses which mention course packs (electronic or printed) altered to reflect this.
- Irish Copyright & Related Acts to be used. Irish legal jurisdiction is to be applied.
- Clause removed discussing indemnifying participants as JSTOR does not indemnify libraries.
- Clauses removed that detail post termination access as there is none with JSTOR. Contacted JSTOR and Clause 5.4 discussing post termination access and referring to the already deleted Clause 2.2.2 has been removed.
